

At age 16, Nick was a promising football athlete when a near fatal traffic accident changed his life.



Overweight and disparaging, Nick was determined to turn his life from a debilitating tragedy into a personal triumph.

Twelve years later, as a professional bodybuilder, wheelchair ballroom dancer, personal trainer, motivational speaker and entertainer, Nick has the enthusiasm, vision, convictions, abilities, and life experience to reach out to inspire and give

Tyson Gentry joined The Ohio State University Buckeyes in 2005 as a walk on punter. He was eager to help out in any way possible, and in 2006, he began filling-in as a receiver during practices. During a spring practice, Tyson went up for a pass and landed in an awkward position that resulted in breaking his C4 vertebra and leaving him paralyzed from the neck down.



Fortunately, this is only the beginning of Tyson's story. In 2009, He completed his studies at OSU with a degree in Behavioral Sciences. He is now attending

OSU's graduate program in speech and language pathology with a goal of becoming a speech therapist. Tyson continues to be a source of inspiration to the team. He attends team meetings, practices and is on the sideline of every home game. Tyson's story is one of courage, perseverance and passion that will leave you in awe of the human spirit.

Sue Thomas, Tuesday 9:00am

Sue Thomas has been profoundly deaf since 18 months of age. Her parents were told she would never amount to anything and she should be placed in an institution. Well, her parents did not listen.

Since a young age, Sue has achieved the unthinkable. At age seven, Sue was, and still is, the youngest Ohio State Champion figure skater. She has a Bachelor of Science degree in Political Science and International Affairs. After graduating, Sue landed




her dream job as an FBI agent working undercover surveillance reading lips. It was this experience that led to the TV series, *SUE THOMAS: F.B.EYE*. This weekly drama helps to bring more awareness to the lives and abilities of those with challenges. In 2001, Sue was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis (MS). Living with MS has become one of Sue's greatest challenges. "Fighting it is a waste of precious energy," she says. "It is only by embracing my MS that I learn life's greatest lessons."
