Expand Access for People with Purpose



- Grew our network to 1,100+ nonprofit members and Friends
- Subsidized memberships for 147 small organizations through partnerships with Maine State Library and Maine Land Trust Network
- Launched MANP's Access Fund to support scholarships and discounted memberships. Awarded \$18,000+ in scholarships to 190+ nonprofit staff and volunteers—a 40% increase!

- 2,100+ people attended 85+ in-person and web-based educational offerings with a focus on rural communities including Dover-Foxcroft, Machias + Presque Isle
- 175+ people from 65+ organizations attended Board Boot Camps—a 30% increase!




