Guardianship is often seen as a solution for individuals with complex needs, but it is important to understand the balance between the guardian's role and the individual's ability to make day-to-day decisions. At this APSI Institute, presenters will discuss the scope and limitations of a guardian's role in circumstances that often arise when working with individuals with complex needs. Each session will offer strategies for collaboration among team members, as well as alternative ways to support the specific needs of the individual.

Participants will:

- Understand the role of guardianship, including its scope and limits, and what to expect when a guardian is involved in a person's team
- Hear a variety of professional perspectives on how guardians and other team members can collaborate to address complex needs
- Engage in discussions about case studies/hypothetical scenarios to develop strategies for serving individuals with complex needs, both under guardianship and through alternative supports
