HHS Provider Relief: The US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced yesterday a third phase of the Provider Relief Fund. This new tranche will distribute another \$20 billion to Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, behavioral health, and substance abuse providers. The application for funds during this phase will open this Monday October 5th and close November 6th. At the moment there is no set percentage or rate set for how much providers will receive. The amount of funds paid out will be determined by the number of providers who apply and a consideration of various factors about each provider's revenue. This new release of funds is more nuanced than the previous ones so it it will be important to thoroughly read the announcement from HHS, by clicking here. Risk/Benefit Discussion Guide: Coinciding with last week's release of indoor visitation guidance for ICFs, DODD released an updated 'Risk/Benefit Discussion Guide', intended to help with team discussions when ICF residents wish to participate in activities outside the home. After getting clarification from DODD, this new discussion guide replaces the previous version also used for adult day services and is intended to be the single tool/guide used by teams when weighing community activities. The tool is not mandatory, but heavily encouraged for team decisions. The updated version no longer includes 'scores' and 'risk levels', aiming to lead to better team discussions. ICF Cost Reporting: For the past few weeks we have been awaiting guidance from the Ohio Department of Medicaid(ODM) regarding cost reporting COVID related expenses and fiscal relief for ICF providers . That guidance was published yesterday by ODM and can be found here. As we work to analyze the guidance, we are seeking member feedback as to whether this guidance provides the clarity needed or whether we need to seek additional input from ODM. <u>HB 770:</u> <u>Ohio House Bill 770 was introduced</u> by Reps Richardson and Fraizer this past Wednesday, aimed at allowing residents of nursing homes and ICFs to designate an essential caregiver that could come into the ICF and help with the care of the resident and provide companionship. This essential caregiver could be a family member, guardian, parent or someone else. This bill presents obvious concerns, and we are working with legislative partners to better understand its origin and likelihood of passage, especially considering the lifting of visitation prohibitions last week.

MSS Workgroup: The committee tasked with implementing a rebuild of the Medicaid Service System (MSS) met this week to continue its work on the overhaul and redesign of the platform. The discussion continued to center around the processes for creating and managing sites, especially as people move in and out of a home. The new design should allow for cleaner work in the system, avoiding much of the 'clutter', eliminating unnecessary sites from appearing in the dashboard once the living situation has changed or the provider is no longer serving that site. 
