
<u>Vaccine Update:</u> As many providers continue to work through phase 1A of the vaccine distribution, Governor DeWine announced the next phase, 1B, which will include people over 65 years old and many people with developmental disabilities. <u>To read the full eligibility requirements and proposed</u> <u>timelines for phase 1B, click here.</u> The process for distribution of the vaccine has been incredibly localized as we have heard very different experiences from members as they work through their pharmacies, local health departments and county boards. If you are still unsure when the people you support may be scheduled for distribution, we encourage you to reach out to your local health department or county board of DD. <u>To see Ohio's Vaccination dashboard, click here.</u>

<u>Appendix K:</u> The application to support providers with an approximately 2-week relief payment seems to be on track and is currently being reviewed by the Ohio Department of Medicaid for submission to CMS. The application will distribute approximately \$78M across providers of residential and day array services, including non-medical transportation. The payment will be determined based on average billings of the period between 8/1 and 10/31. <u>DODD is requesting</u> <u>providers submit billing through October by next Wednesday, 1/13</u> in order to maximize their relief payment. The state is also readying a re-application of regulatory relaxations through appendix K, including items necessary for STEP service delivery. The application period will expire 6 months after the state of emergency is declared over.

PPP2: The most recent federal relief package included provisions for an additional round of the Payroll Protection Program, with new requirements for returning and first-time borrowers. As further guidance and interim rules were published by the Small Business Administration and Treasury today, the law will allow agencies with 300 or fewer employees that can demonstrate significant losses in 2020, and who have spent all of their original PPP loan will be eligible for an additional round of the forgivable loan program.

<u>OOD Focus Group:</u> This week we attended a focus group, led by OOD, aimed at providing feedback on <u>Ohio's Workforce Success Measures Dashboard.</u> The WSM is a collaborative effort between OSU and Ohio's Office of Workforce Transformation that measures the outcomes of workforce development programs such as vocational rehabilitation, WIOA and certification programs. The group is looking to improve the dashboard to be more friendly to job-seekers and people participating in those programs. OOD will be sending out a survey that we will share with our Employment Service Committee to gather provider feedback on the dashboard.

<u>Welcome Rachel Hayes!</u> We are very happy to have Rachel Hayes join our team this week as the Director of Residential Resources. Rachel comes to OPRA with great experience in ICF, Residential waiver, as well as day services. The MUI unit at DODD wanted us to clarify with members that there is no requirement for people to be trained on the Well-Informed publications. The MUI Rule only requires training for the Health and Welfare Alerts. The "Well-Informed" is great information but not required training.
