<u>Vaccine Mandate:</u> Following last week's Supreme Court decision to overturn the OSHA Vaccination and Testing mandate, but uphold the CMS rule, we know providers are working tirelessly to develop the necessary policies as the new implementation dates approach. During this morning'c member call, Rachel presented an outline and history of the different orders and where things stand now as far established guidance and requirements of the mandate. We are still seeking final clarification from CMS as to whether the order extends to contracted staff providing services to ICF residents outside of the facility (contracted day services/active treatment). There has been conflicting guidance on this piece over the last month, but we expect to know a final answer by next week, when we meet with CMS representatives.

<u>Waiver Nursing:</u> Last week we began taking data from our waiver provider members regarding nursing and how others are utilizing their nursing, how many nurses are on payroll, and training time vs. actual time with individuals. So we do want to thank all of you who submitted answers on the survey. We are now in the process of analyzing that data to come up with our "asks" regarding the reimbursement rate for nursing. We know that nursing is underfunded. And we know we need to take a look at it and see what we can do with it. So the small action group that is taking a look at it is doing just that. We will be meeting again soon and once we come up with a plan for our asks, we will then take this to the health care and policy committees before taking the recommendations to the board. <u>ICF Survey:</u> This week we also sent out a survey to our ICF members regarding the Development Rule. We think this is a good time to go back to the department with both reasons and suggestions as to why this rule may need to be changed. So we've sent the survey out which is due by the 24th to see where members are at with this. And similar to the waiver nursing action group, we have a small action group that will be analyzing the data we receive back from the survey to guide what our asks may be with this. And once we come up with a plan for our asks, we will then take it to Policy and the board before sending off to the department.

<u>Self-Directed Transportation:</u> Last week DODD held the kick-off meeting for the team working on the implementation of the 'Self-Directed Transportation' service/rule, intended to be brought up in July of 2022. This service would allow individuals to access Uber, Lyft, and other ride-sharing and additional transportation options not traditionally available through waiver services such as NMT and HPC Transportation. This service has been a major goal of self-advocates in Ohio and was one of Director Davis' priorities during his tenure. There are many details to be considered as this service heads towards final rule-making and implementation. Please contact <u>Scott</u> with any questions or additional feedback about this service.

<u>OOD Quarterly:</u> OOD held their quarterly stakeholder meeting yesterday. The presentation included information on the AWARE vendor portal rollout, the initiative to revise the fee schedule, <u>and these fiscal reports</u>, outlining the decrease in authorization and funding for job placement services.



- 1,500 people served have tested positive for COVID-19 and been hospitalized. There were 33 additional positives since the 1/13 report.
- There were 28 additional hospitalizations since the 1/13 report. This is a total of 2,437 people hospitalized and tested for COVID-19.
 - A total of 2,582 COVID-19 reportable MUIs have been filed as 145 individuals were never hospitalized but COVID-19 was suspected or later determined as their cause of death.
- 321 people served have passed away who have tested positive for COVID-19. There were 8 additional confirmed deaths since the 1/13 report.

Impacted Counties/Developmental Centers:

- There are 86 counties and 8 developmental centers with COVID related MUIs (CADC, CDC, GDC, TDC, MVDC, SODC, WDC and NODC).
- Franklin had the most people hospitalized and tested with 260 followed by Cuyahoga with 251.
- Cuyahoga had the most people tested positive with 154 and Franklin had 137.

Testing Demographics:

- Males accounted for 59.37% of those tested and females 40.63%.
 - Ages of people tested ranged from 1 to 95 years. The average age was 54 years. The most common ages are 62.
- The breakdown of people tested by race is:
 - Black or African American-14% (56% positive testing rate)
 - Other Race -2% (56% positive testing rate)
 - Unknown-5% (52% positive testing rate)
 - White/Caucasian 79% (56% positive testing rate)

COVID-19 Deaths:

- · The mortality rate of those passing from COVID-19 (321) and the total people served (98,956) is 0.
- The ages of those who died range from 4-95 years of age.
- The average age of the person who died was 60 years old.
- · A total of 67 counties and 4 DCs (CDC, MVDC, NODC, TDC) have reported COVID-19 deaths
- · Franklin has the most confirmed COVID deaths with 25.
