Retention Program: After several marathon legislative sessions, Ohio's legislature amended and passed HB 45, including language authorizing the 6.5% Retention program we have been discussing for the past several months. Soon following the passage of that bill, Governor Mike DeWine signed an executive Order, authorizing the rules to go forward implementing the program. Late last week, DODD sent out this communication, detailing the structure of the program, how providers can opt in, the reporting requirements and other important aspects of how this program will work. Because of the delayed implementation, the first quarter of the program will include 3 distinct provider payments, corresponding back to the previous 3 quarters worth of billing to be distributed to eligible staff throughout that quarter. In the subsequent quarters, the program will revert to its regular 'one quarter at a time' process. **DODD has set up this webpage** dedicated to the program and questions for DODD can be directed to this dedicated email address here. We want to thank all of our system partners who have made this initiative possible and most importantly, all of you for your patience through this process. EVV: The Ohio Department of Medicaid currently does NOT have a timeline for turning on claims denials for missing or claims with insufficient Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) units. ODM said they are confident it will not happen in the next few months and will make sure to communicate the date this function will turn will all interested parties. However, there still is a rule that requires you to use EVV if you are providing any of the required services: 15-min HPC and waiver nursing. <u>Works4Me Grant:</u> Earlier this week OOD held an introductory meeting to the 'Works4Me' project, funding intended to help people working in or contemplating working in sub-minimum wage employment to find Competitive Integrated Employment opportunities. The project, which will begin with a pilot in NorthEast Ohio, will focus on jobs in the 'essential workers' and 'the arts' labor sectors. Rep. Sweeney Testimony: As Ohio's House of Representatives debated amendments to HB 45 until the early morning hours last week, we wanted to flag this moment from Rep Bride Rose Sweeney, who represents western Cuyahoga County and has visited with OPRA members. Just after 3 minutes into the video, the Rep. makes the case for funding for ICFs, citing the advocacy she's heard during her time in office, showing the importance of this outreach.
