<u>Budget Testimony:</u> Thank you to everyone who submitted written testimony and provided verbal, inperson testimony in the HHS subcommittee. We want to thank the OPRA members that provided verbal testimony in the Subcommittee: Open Door, St. Joseph Home, RT Industries, Independence of Portage County, Fuse Network, RHAM, Koinonia, Echoing Hills, Heinzerling, and Empowering People! You should be proud of your fellow OPRA members for advocating our system, the services we all provide, and most importantly the people you serve and the people you employ.

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Since the sub-committee completed their hearings and now the bill will be heard in the full House Finance Committee. The full House Finance Committee will have their first day of testimony next Tuesday and will continue through Thursday and then on the following Tuesday. <u>Christine</u> sent instructions on how to submit written testimony to the House Finance Committee with a template. If you submitted testimony during the sub-committee, you will need to make a few tweaks in the heading and in the body of the testimony before submitting your testimony. If you submitted to the subcommittee, we encourage you to submit again. If you were not able to submit to the

<u>Blueprint:</u> Following stakeholder feedback, this week DODD reconvened a stakeholder workgroup to refine and further develop the '<u>quality program' component of the Blueprint ADS proposal</u>. DODD's Keith Banner led the discussion, which mainly focused on a 'SWOT analysis' of the current proposal to determine which elements to build upon, modify, or abandon. This group will meet regularly for the next month with a goal of a consensus program that can be piloted by late 2023.

<u>Commercial NMT:</u> Last month, DODD proposed changes to the Non-Medical Transportation rule, further restricting what providers can qualify as 'commercial' transporters. As we advocated against these changes, we also proposed an alternative service specifically for transporting people into the community for work. DODD will look to develop this/rule service in 2024 and have 'grandfathered' any providers currently using the commercial code to transport people to competitive employment for the next year while the new service is developed. <u>Click here to read the clearance comments</u>.

<u>GSFO Grant:</u> Our friends at the Good Sheperd Foundation of Ohio have shared their 2023 grant application, which supports extracurricular activities for people living in residential service settings. <u>You can download the application here.</u> Applications are due May 5th, 2023.

<u>PHE:</u> This week the Biden Administration has made the decision to <u>disband their COVID task force</u> in May. This coincides with the ending of the Public Health Emergency on May 11th.
