<u>Budget Testimony:</u> The Senate Finance Committee heard testimony on Medicaid and health provisions in the budget. Tony Thomas and Leslie Linnevers from Welcome House, Diane Beastrom and Derrick Bruggeman from Koinonia, Jo Spargo from REM Ohio, Laura Lamb from VGS, and Matt Lehner, Danielle South and JaNan Maclin from Heinzerling Community represented the system yesterday by providing verbal testimony in committee. <u>You can watch part one of</u> <u>yesterday's hearing here</u> (Start at the 1 hour and 50 minute mark to see Tony, Leslie, Diane Derrick, Jo, and Laura). You can read all of the written <u>testimony here.</u> The next big budget update will come on June 6th when the Senate releases their version of the budget. If you are interested in advocacy between now and then, we encourage you to either call or email your state Senators stressing the importance of the services you provide and why increases to funding is necessary. <u>Workforce Reinvestment Act:</u> This week OPRA submitted written testimony in support of <u>HB108, the</u> <u>Non-Profit Workforce Reinvestment act</u>. The bill, sponsored by Reps Nick Santucci and Adam Miller, would allow non-profits that operate retail stores to reinvest up to 25% of state sales tax back into their workforce development programs for people with disabilities. Our partners at the Ohio Goodwill Association have championed the legislation, which we believe will be a meaningful benefit to OPRA members who operate retail operations and provide employment services. <u>Click here to read OPRA's</u> <u>testimony in support of HB108.</u>

<u>HCBS Access Rule:</u> Recently we have discussed the <u>new proposed Access Rule from CMS.</u> In this rule there is a piece in the pre-amble which discusses 80% of revenue that needs to go to wages. Our initial analysis suggests the rule does not apply to Ohio's I/DD services and in particular, residential habilitation, day habilitation, and home-based community services. We will continue to work with our national partners and keep members informed as we prepare comments on the rule.

<u>ODOT Rest Stop Project:</u> We have recently been made aware of a renovation project on many of Ohio's highway rest areas operated by ODOT. Our state partners at ODOT, DAS, DODD and OOD are working together to identify potential solutions and other contract positions that can be filled by workers displaced by the project. <u>Yesterday we sent this survey to members</u> so we can better understand the impact and how many workers are potentially affected and will need to find other work opportunities.
