Most recently, Teresa helped launch the Office of Policy at OCALI, a global leader in autism and disability. More than any classroom or professional role, however, Teresa's greatest learning experiences have come from her kids — both of whom

ICF Trade Meeting: We had the opportunity to meet as associations representing ICFs to discuss some of the current issues and trends, especially as they relate to ODH surveys. Notably, we have seen an increase in citations for PRN medications, particularly for mental health diagnosis. There is a concern that a prohibition of PRN meds could result in a situation affecting health and safety. It's not feasible to call each time and get an order right then for many reasons. CMS stated they know that there are times it's needed but they are strongly concerned with people becoming overmedicated. ODH has had conversations about this with CMS and they are looking to provide more guidance. As a reminder, our review/survey feedback form can be found on the website here.

<u>Telehealth Assessment:</u> This week we also attended a meeting on the 'telehealth assessment' waiver service DODD is looking to bring up in order to make the 'Station MD-type' pilot program a permanent service option. We reviewed some potential rule language as well as Station MD's process and how that can be operationalized into rule. While there is much to still work through, we are hopeful at the opportunity for this service, which many members have utilized, to become a permanent option for waiver services and beyond.

<u>ES Coach:</u> Thanks to everyone who attended our Day and Employment services committee yesterday. We had some great discussions, as well as hosting a team from the Institute for Community Inclusion in Boston to share their 'ES Coach' resource. While we have shared information on this free resource before, it was great to have the team from ICI speak in detail about the resource, which is essentially an app that employment professionals put on their phone, which then gives a daily activity prompt. We've heard great feedback about the app, which is still free for participating providers through 2024. You can learn more here. Reach out to <u>Scott</u> with questions.
