<u>Conference!</u>: We look forward to seeing everyone next week at our Fall Conference and OPRA 50th Anniversary celebration gala. We're at full capacity for the conference, gala and PAC fundraiser, so are excited about a great week of learning and connecting. See you next week!



<u>Payment Issues:</u> Between the FI transition delaying adjustment claims, issues regarding EVV, and other system glitches, we have received many emails from members experiencing significant payment delays. We are working with system partners to try to resolve these issues and/or get payments resumed and will keep in touch with members as we do.

<u>Case for Inclusion:</u> Our friends at ANCOR and United Cerebral Palsey have released their annual 'Case for Inclusion' report, which has focused on the impact of DSP workforce shortages over the past few years. This year's report is presented as a data snapshot, which shows that national DSP wages have increased to \$15.79 as turnover and vacancy rates have decreased. The report also mentions new methods for capturing how many people are on waiting lists and 'Interest lists' to better capture how many people are really waiting to receive services. <u>You can read the Data Snapshot here.</u>

<u>Supported Decision Making:</u> After an 8-month grant project completed by Ohio APSI and its partners, The DODD Supported Decision-Making Project Toolkit is now available <u>here.</u> This toolkit is intended to "make a substantial impact on the understanding and utilization of supported decision-making and other forms of self-determination." APSI will be presenting at our conference next week to share more information about this project and toolkit.

Adult Use Cannabis FAQ: As mentioned on this morning's call, we received the frequently asked questions document from our partners at Vorys regarding recreational marijuana/adult use cannabis. The FAQs are divided into two basic categories- first with questions regarding to what policies you can implement as employers and then move to questions about what policies you can implement as providers. This is intended to be a "living" document. As you continue to sort through situations involving recreational marijuana, please feel free to send them to us and we will update the document to provide additional guidance.
