<u>Legislative Updates:</u> This week saw Ohio's legislature hold hearings on 3 bills of interest to OPRA and its members;

HB 676- Pediatric Prescribed Extended Care (PPEC) - On Tuesday, the House Families and Aging Committee hosted the first hearing for the bill that would create PPECs. The hearing only included testimony from the sponsors, Reps. Baker and Abrams. The committee has scheduled another hearing for next Tuesday at 11am for interested parties, opponent, and proponents of the bill. <u>SB 296- STABLE Accounts-</u> On Tuesday, the Senate Medicaid Committee held the first hearing for SB 296, which would exempt STABLE accounts from Medicaid estate recovery. The hearing only included sponsor testimony (Sen. Brenner). A second hearing has not been scheduled.

<u>HB 236- Never Alone Act-</u>On Wednesday, the Senate Health Committee held a hearing for proponents on the Never Alone Act. OPRA has been involved in a number of recent conversations on possible additional amendments to the bill, but do not know if any of the amendments will be accepted by the sponsors or the Committee.

<u>ANCOR ICF Call:</u> Discussion in this week's national call centered around CMS considering updates to the ICF/IID regulations, emphasizing modernization and enhanced access to care. They have already flagged areas to make changes including tags W312, W180, W327, and W262. Additionally, they are open to hearing about any other parts of the regulations that may need a refresh to meet the needs of today's population and improve the quality of care. <u>HR Committee:</u> Thank you to everyone who joined the HR Committee! The Committee focused on a recent ruling on the Department of Labor's Overtime Exemption regulation that was published last Friday. <u>Employment First:</u> This week, the Employment First Taskforce met for the first time since 2017. The purpose of this group is to provide direction and guidance to the EF Advisory Committee, a multi-departmental group that steers employment service policy. The meeting recapped the past decade of employment developments and began focusing on future guidance the the committee.
