<u>Committees:</u> Thank you to everyone who attended our Residential Waiver and ICF Committee Meetings this week. We had some pretty robust discussion in both groups, particularly around HB 236 (Never Alone Act). <u>Tech First Advisory:</u> Members of the OPRA team attended DODD's Technology First Advisory Committee meeting this week. The committee, which has not met in several years, is intended to set direction on policies and initiatives that will bolster technology supports in DD services. The meeting focused on a review of the last several years of remote and assistive tech services and then groups moved into recommendations and vision-setting for the future of tech services. <u>Federal Funding News:</u> On Saturday morning, President Biden signed a government funding bill and avoiding a government shutdown. Congress passed the bill on Saturday, keeping the government fully funded through March 14th. The funding deal came after a week of failed attempts to pass a bill to keep the government funded. HB 236- Never Alone Act: Earlier this week, Governor DeWine signed HB236, The Never Alone Act. The bill allows residents in a congregate care setting to designate and have access to an advocate, "especially during a health emergency".
