<u>State Budget:</u> This week the Ohio House passed House Bill 96, the state budget bill, sending the budget process over to the Senate. Primarily, and for our purposes, the omnibus bill looks mostly similar to the substitute bill introduced by the House Finance Committee a few weeks back. Most notably for providers, the latest version of the bill includes EVV language that allow providers to review and correct claims, prohibits claim denials solely based on EVV data, and bans audits based only on EVV records. The bill maintains the funding levels for DD services as proposed through Governor DeWine's executive proposal and the substitute bill introduced weeks back. There is much advocacy to be done as the budget heads to the Senate and we will keep members informed on ways they can get involved in the advocacy process. <u>Federal Budget:</u> This week, the US House of Representatives <u>passed a concurrent budget resolution</u>, advancing the process for budget reconciliation with the US Senate. Of greatest interest/concern in regards to Medicaid funding, the resolution still instructs the House Energy and Commerce Committee (which oversees Medicaid funding) to cut \$880B over the next decade, while the Senate's instructions only call for \$1B in cuts. These two sets of instructions will still have to be reconciled and ultimately match in a final budget bill. Given that both House and Senate committees will begin their work to find those reductions, the advocacy around the importance of Medicaid to disability services is more important than ever.

<u>Medicaid Resource Center:</u> Given the above, we wanted to provide the links again to <u>ANCOR's Medicaid</u> <u>Resource Center.</u> Here you will find social media toolkits, the ANCOR Amplifier, FAQs and other educational resources, expert analyses and many other resources to aid in your education and advocacy. <u>HB 225:</u> This week saw the introduction of <u>House Bill 225, The 'Employment First and Greater Opportunities Act'</u>. The bill, sponsored by Reps Dontavius Jarrells and Tom Young looks to eliminate commensurate wages over 5 years, while also supporting a tax credit to entities that purchase from qualified non-profit agencies that employ people with developmental disabilities. The bill is currently pending referral to the Commerce and Labor committee. Please reach out to <u>Scott</u> or <u>Christine</u> with any questions.
