Senate Medicaid Committee: This week, the Ohio Senate Medicaid Committee heard testimony from the Directors of DODD, OOD, JMOC, and ODM and from a panel hosted by the DD Budget Coalition on HB 96, the state operating budget bill. You can read all of the testimony here. You can view a recording of the hearing here. On May 6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, the Committee will hold public hearings on HB 96. Christine sent out a separate email with draft testimony and instructions on how to submit written testimony. <u>Waiver Redesign:</u> DODD met with association stakeholders this week to give an update on their Waiver Redesign work, of which one focus has been a new assessment tool to replace the DDP and AAI. Following advocacy and discussion beginning earlier this year, DODD is no longer planning to adopt the Supports Intensity Scale (SIS), as previously planned. DODD is now planning to instead <u>adopt the InterRAI instrument</u>. While there is still a lot to understand about this instrument and rollout, we are glad to see DODD move away from the SIS, which we had significant concerns about. <u>House Health Committee:</u> The Ohio House Health Committee held a hearing on HB 141, a bill to create pediatric prescribed extended care centers. The hearing was sponsor testimony only. Proponent testimony will be accepted at next week's hearing scheduled for Wednesday at 10am. <u>Federal Medicaid Advocacy:</u> The US House of Representatives are just weeks away from releasing their proposal for Medicaid reform that could potentially lead to significant cuts in program funding and services. Members of the OPRA team returned to DC this week to continue our advocacy on the protection of disability services, ahead of the Energy and Commerce committee's 'markup', which is now expected/due on May 12<sup>th</sup>. There is growing concern in Congress over the impact of potential cuts to Medicaid as we approach this crucial moment. We are urging members to reach out to their members of Congress to explain the importance of these services to Ohioans with developmental disabilities. <u>OPRA EVV Discussion-</u> We are hosting an EVV open discussion/town hall meeting open to all OPRA Members next Thursday May 8th from 10am to noon. The goal is to develop ideas for resources as claims denials are turned on for EVV-required DODD services and to develop policy suggestions to improve the EVV experience. 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
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
