<u>HB 96 (State Operating Budget)</u>: The Senate Medicaid Committee held its second hearing on HB 96 on Tuesday. The hearing was open to the public and the Committee accepted testimony on all parts of the budget related to Medicaid and OOD. <u>You can watch a recording of the testimony here.</u> You can read all of the in-person and <u>written testimony here</u>. Thank you to the OPRA members submitted written testimony for this hearing! The Senate Medicaid Committee will be hosting the third and final hearing on HB 96 next Thursday (May 15) at 9am. <u>Blueprint Proposals:</u> Earlier this week, DODD shared the two new rule drafts for Basic Employment Skills Training (BEST) and Group Employment Supports (GES). The two new rule drafts attempt to address several of the concerns from the previous proposal, although still raises some questions, some of which we have already posed to DODD. We appreciate the updated attempt from DODD, who is seeking our feedback by May 23rd. <u>To download the rule drafts and read OPRA's initial synopsis, click here</u>. <u>OPRA EVV Discussion</u>: Thank you to everyone who joined our EVV Town Hall. Christine shared the recording of the meeting and a revised slide deck through the main OPRA Member listserve. <u>SB 35 (Supported Decision Making)</u>: The Senate Judiciary Committee held the third public hearing for SB 35, a bill to codify supported decision making. OPRA previously submitted testimony in support of the bill. You can watch a <u>recording of the hearing here</u>. <u>HB 141 (PPEC)</u>: This week the House Health Committee held the second public testimony for HB 141, which creates pediatric prescribed extended care centers. OPRA submitted testimony in support of the bill. You can watch a <u>recording of the hearing here</u>. <u>HB 225 (eliminate sub-min wage):</u> The House Commerce and Labor Committee held the first hearing on HB 225, a bill to eliminate the payment of sub-minimum wages for people with developmental disabilities. The hearing was testimony from only the two sponsors, Reps. Jarrells and Young. You can watch a <u>recording of the hearing here</u>. You can read the bill's language, LSC analysis, and <u>the sponsor's testimony here</u>. The Commerce and Labor Committee will be having another hearing for HB 225 next Wednesday at 11am. The hearing will be for proponent testimony only. Please reach out to <u>Christine</u> if you are interested in participating in the hearing.

<u>HR Committee-</u> The OPRA HR Committee will be having our next meeting on Thursday, May 15th from 10noon. Bob Harris, a partner at Vorys, will be joining to review what HR professionals need to know about hiring immigrants, recent changes in immigration policy, and how changing policy is impacting immigration enforcement. Christine sent out a calendar invite with the zoom link for the meeting this week.
