Blessing will present an overview of the *Inmate to Citizen Program*, a 5-year project funded by the New York State Developmental Disabilities Planning Council that incorporated a person-centered approach into how the New York State Department of Correctional Services rehabilitated and prepared individuals with intellectual disabilities for community living, learning, and earning upon release. Also discussed will be how person-centered practices can facilitate successful reentry of offenders with intellectual disabilities.
