If a person shares supports with other people who require either HPC or OSOC, only HPC or OSOC may be authorized.

Overnight Supports Assessment - All Possible Recommendations

H1	HPC is the only suitable authorization based on the information you entered. The person requires physical/total support during the night at a frequency that is incompatible with OSOC.
H2	HPC is the only suitable authorization based on the information you entered. The person requires physical/total support during the night at a frequency that is incompatible with OSOC. You also indicated that the hours in which these needs arise are varied and/or unpredictable. As a result, it is recommended that HPC is authorized for at least 30 days so that the provider can observe and document in detail the person's overnight needs and the team can discuss whether trends or patterns emerge.
H3	You indicated this person requires in-person supervision/monitoring based on a court order. As a result, the only suitable authorization is HPC.
H4	You indicated this person requires supervision/monitoring which has led to in-person supports being provided several times per month. As a result, the only suitable authorization in this case would be HPC, because the person has a known and likely need for in-person support overnight.
H5	You indicated that this person needs physical and/or total supports a few times per month overnight, that they do not sleep uninterrupted throughout the night, and that they do not know when to ask for help. As a result, HPC is the suitable authorization.
H6	You indicated that this person needs physical and/or total supports a few times per month overnight, and that they do not know when to ask for help. As a result, HPC is the only suitable authorization.
H7	You indicated this person requires supervision/monitoring which has led to in-person supports being provided several times per month. As a result, the only suitable authorization in this case would be HPC, because the person has a known and likely need for in-person support overnight.
H8	You indicated that this person needs verbal/gestural supports a few times per month overnight, and that they do not know when to ask for help. As a result, HPC is the only suitable authorization.
H9	You indicated this person lives with others who require HPC overnight. You also indicated this person does not need supports or supervision overnight, however they do not usually sleep through the night. As a result, HPC is the only suitable authorization.
H10	You indicated this person lives with others who also require HPC or OSOC. You also indicated that they do not have any physical or total support needs overnight, nor do they require supervision that has resulted in in-person supports being provided. However, they do not sleep uninterrupted. As a result, HPC is likely suitable given the information you entered below.
H11	You indicated this person lives with others who require either HPC or OSOC overnight. You also indicated that this person needs Supervision that has resulted in in-person supports being provided several times in the past month. As a result, HPC is likely suitable given the information you entered.
H12	You indicated this person doesn't know when to ask for help, nor would they be able to recognize an emergency in their home without physical or total support. You also indicated this person doesn't sleep uninterrupted throughout the night - as a result, HPC is the only suitable authorization.
H13	You indicated this person lives with others who require HPC or OSOC overnight. You also indicated that this person requires verbal supports overnight, and they do not sleep uninterrupted until they wake in the morning. As a result, HPC is the only suitable authorization.
O1	You indicated this person lives with others who require HPC or OSOC overnight. You also indicated that this person does not require supports or supervision overnight, and that they usually sleep uninterrupted until they wake in the morning. As a result, OSOC is the only suitable authorization.
O2	You indicated this person doesn't have supervision or support needs overnight, but they need physical/total assistance to evacuate their home. As a result, OSOC is suitable.
O3	You indicated this person lives with others who also require HPC or OSOC. You also indicated that they do not have any physical or total support needs overnight, nor do they require supervision. However, they do sleep uninterrupted. As a result, OSOC is likely suitable given the information you entered below.
O4	You indicated this person lives with others who also require HPC or OSOC. You also indicated that they do not have any physical or total support needs overnight, nor do they require supervision that has resulted in in-person supports being provided. However, they do sleep uninterrupted. As a result, OSOC is likely suitable given the information you entered below.

O5	You indicated this person lives with others who require HPC or OSOC overnight. You also indicated that this person does not require supports or supervision overnight, and that they usually sleep uninterrupted until they wake in the morning. However, you also indicated that they do not know when to ask for help. As a result, OSOC is the only suitable authorization.
O6	You indicated this person doesn't have support or supervision needs overnight, that they do know when to ask for help, but that they need physical or total support to recognize an emergency. As a result, the only suitable authorization is OSOC.
O7	You indicated this person would not be able to recognize an emergency in their home without physical or total support. You also indicated this person sleeps uninterrupted throughout the night - as a result, OSOC is the only suitable authorization.
O8	You indicated this person needs verbal or gestural support to recognize an emergency in their home, but that they would require physical or total assistance to evacuate. You also indicated this person sleeps uninterrupted throughout the night - as a result, OSOC is the only suitable authorization.
O9	You indicated this person doesn't know when to ask for help, nor would they be able to recognize an emergency in their home without physical or total support. You also indicated this person sleeps uninterrupted throughout the night - as a result, OSOC is the only suitable authorization.
O10	You indicated this person lives with others who require HPC or OSOC overnight. You also indicated that this person does not require supports overnight, but they do require supervision that has resulted in supports being provided 2 or fewer times per month. You also indicated that the person usually sleeps uninterrupted until they wake in the morning. As a result, OSOC is likely the only suitable authorization.
R1	It sounds like Remote Supports would be perfect for this person!
R2	Remote Supports might be difficult for this person - however, the Team should still seriously consider how it might work - including by talking to some Remote Supports vendors, providers, etc.
R3	You indicated this person doesn't know when to ask for help, but that they have all the other necessary skills for Remote Supports to be a strong possibility. The Team should consider scenarios where the person has not been able to ask for help, and whether that is a true barrier to their potential use of Remote Supports, given their other skills. It might also help to speak with a Remote Supports vendor in your area about what they've seen work for other people with similar situations.
R4	If the person can't currently communicate their wants/needs to those that don't know them well, that's ok! Remote Supports don't always require voice communication - there are methods that allow for communication devices, etc., so don't let this hold the team back!
R5	If the person isn't currently comfortable being alone in their own home, that's ok! Think of ways that the person could work towards spending more time on their own - even if just for a few minutes at a time. Remote Supports COULD work for this person, but the Team will have to get creative!
